THE CITY GREENLIGHTS CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW IRISH CENTER



After nearly twenty months navigating the city's planning procedures, our blueprint to reconstruct the Irish Center was officially endorsed at City Hall by the board of supervisors on Tuesday, December 12, 2023.

A celebratory milestone was marked at the Center on Saturday, December 16th, with Mayor London Breed gracing us with her presence for a ceremony that sealed the deal to progress with the new building plans.

ment will house a diverse range of event spaces, a museum, library, exhibition areas, and will serve as a hub for the numerous cultural and educational initiatives we envision for the future.

Our donors, supporters, and the members of the new building team—specifically Leo Cassidy, Mark Conroe, Redmond Lyons, and Michael Coleman—have played pivotal roles in this achievement.

CROSS WEAVING WORKSHOP ST. BRIGID'S DAY CELEBRATION FEBRUARY 4

Back by popular demand and hosted by the UICC, the Irish Marvels cultural program, and the Patrick J. Dowling Library, this family friendly workshop offers instruction and materials for making your own cross. Tea, soda bread, and other refreshments will be provided.

There were many regional styles and variations throughout Ireland with different materials used. Families would recite prayers, bless the rushes or straw with holy water and then each make the crosses. They would hang them over the door and around the home to welcome St Brigid. Many households kept the cross each year in the under-thatch of the house and you could tell how old a house was or how long the family had lived there by the number of crosses in the roof!

Space is limited! Registration closes on Feb. 2 so as to ensure we have enough materials for all attendees. There will be a limited number of spaces available at the door.
